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By submitting a Research Institute: 3 Minute Thesis abstract, you agree to the following:

1. Only active PhD students (including candidates whose thesis is under submission) can make a submission under this category. Must be student by the date of the Congress. Graduates are not eligible.
2. Evidence of status is required at time of abstract submission.
3. The submission must be the work of the PhD student.
4. All abstracts must be submitted in either English or French and via the online submission site only. Other forms of submission for example by post, email or fax will NOT be accepted.
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6. Abstracts MUST be structured to include: **Objectives and Significance, Method, Impact / Results, Conclusion / Outcomes.**
Abstracts without this structure will not be accepted.
7. Proposed studies/presentations should be significantly advanced or completed at the time of abstract submission. Statements made in abstracts should be supported by evidence. In the case of research that is not completed, the evidence may reflect projected or preliminary data.
8. The author is responsible for the accuracy of the abstract. The acceptance of an abstract does not imply provision of travel, accommodation or registration for the Congress, nor any other costs associated with preparation or presentation of the abstract, or any costs associated with attendance at the Congress.
9. By submitting an abstract, you (and any collaborators and supervisor) give permission for the abstract to be published in printed materials, website, App and social media.
10. If the author has any commercial interests or associations that might pose a conflict of interest regarding this submission, they must be declared. If accepted for presentation, the commercial interest or association must be declared on the PowerPoint slide.
11. You confirm that you will not submit abstract if previously published elsewhere.
12. The author agrees to present the material described and accepted in their abstract submission.
13. The author can only submit this abstract ONCE for consideration in the programme. It cannot be submitted under another category (for example poster).
14. The presenting author of the accepted abstract must be registered by 8 December 2021 to ensure inclusion of the abstract in Congress materials and in order to be scheduled for presentation.
15. There is a limit of one presenter per presentation. Authors will be notified regarding the outcome of the abstract submission on or shortly after 23 June 2021. Abstracts will undergo an anonymous review by two (or more) peers.
16. The presenting author must be available to present the abstract if selected for the programme. The presenting author will notify the WFOT 2022 Congress Office if they are unable to present an abstract as soon as possible.
